All of these "non-talented" ladies with God's gifts, we were able to raise an additional \$400+ for mites.



Pastor Aschenbeck asked that we pray not only for encouragement and strength but that they would be bold witnesses of Christ's love to people who struggle to see or experience little hope and joy in life.

We have paid our first mission grant of this biennium to Mission Central and our next mite gift will be given to Lutheran Family Services in the amount of \$10,000 for the "At Ease—Ministry for Vets and Military". This is a more local endeavor to help those suffering from stress and mental illness after serving our country in the military. As we experience God's gracious gifts and love may we give what we can for missions along with prayers for those who are at work nearby and around the world telling others about Christ's love.
