Blessings on your day everyone! My name is Karla Koehler and I am humbled to be your Recording Secretary. I was elected in 2016 and will serve until 2020. As I reflect back on our convention theme, "His light on our path" and I am constantly reminded how we as Christians are part of that light when we reflect God's love for all of us. We are that light when a child needs comforted, when our friends need a listening ear, when a family member needs care, when we work at our jobs, and really everything we do especially in our relationships.

After a convention I read a story on social media that has stuck with me. Perhaps you read it too. It can be found at www.shaunashanks.com and is titled "An Unexpected Note that Left Me Breathless." Shauna spoke at Christmas event and received this note from an attendee:

"This happened last night after the ladies Christmas Party with a young lady that I invited with her mother. I was in Dollar Tree last night and there was a lady and two kids behind me in the LONG line. One was a big kid, one was a toddler. The bigger one had a pack of glow sticks and the baby was screaming for them so the Mom opened the pack and gave him one, which stopped his tears. He walked around with it smiling, but then the bigger boy took it and the baby started screaming again. Just as the Mom was about to fuss at the older child, he bent the glow stick and handed it back to the baby. As we walked outside at the same time, the baby noticed that the stick was now glowing and his brother said, 'I had to break it so you could get the full effect from it.' The author then stated, "I almost ran because I could hear God saying to me, 'I had to break you to show you why I created you. You had to go through it so you could fulfill your purpose." That little baby was happy just swinging that 'unbroken' glow stick around in the air because he did not understand what it was created to do which was 'glow.' There are some people who will be content just 'being' but some of us that God has chosen, we have to be 'broken.' We have to get sick. We go through divorce. We have to bury our spouse, our parents, best friend, or child because, in those moments of desperation, God is breaking us but when the breaking is done, then we will be able to see the reason for which we were created."

What a beautiful reminder as we struggle with the brokenness in our world and our own struggles. Let us let God's light shine in us as we go through trials, tribulations, and triumphs. In good times, in bad times, in times of plenty and in times of need, let us Praise him and let us share His light as He lights our path! Spend time in His Word and reflect on how he can work through you and with you. "Let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in Heaven." Matthew 5:16.

The Cross above all else.

And the LORD God commanded the man, "You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat of it you will surely die" (Genesis 2:16-17) Thus began our struggle with the tree. This luscious green tree that was to be left alone became an unavoidable temptation.

I spent a lot of time in trees in my youth. From elms to cedars to apple and apricot, from maple to cherry and peach, I climbed them all-even a few I could not name. Perhaps my favorite was the elm. It had branches larger than the trunks of most other trees in our yard. It had footholds in just the right places for me to scramble up so I could look down at the world. I felt as mighty as the tree itself when nestled in its branches. Then came the dreaded Dutch elm disease and I found myself on the other end of a two-man saw from my brother as we spent a long summer cutting that once majestic tree into firewood. How quickly life can be ended.

So it was also for our Savior. One moment he is riding into Jerusalem to shouts of "Hosanna," and the next moment the crowd is shouting, "Crucify!"

As they led him away, they seized Simon from Cyrene, who was on his way in from the country, and put the cross on him and made him carry it behind Jesus. A large number of people followed him, including women who mourned and wailed for him. Jesus turned and said to them, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep for yourselves and for your children. For the time will come when you will say, 'Blessed are the barren women, the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed!' Then "they will say to the mountains, "Fall on us!" and to the hills, "Cover us!" 'For if men do these things when the tree is green, what will happen when it is dry?" (Luke 23:26-31)

On that dry, wooden cross, Jesus died for our sins. From the first sin of Adam and Eve with the tree of the knowledge of good and evil to when Jesus returns again, He died for all sins. That cross, that cruel crucifixion cross has become the place we look to know the price for our sins has been paid. So too the cross stands above all else in the LWML logo to remind us that Jesus died for us. Thanks be to God.

AWESOME CONVENTION-AWESOME WOMEN OF LWML

Ladies of LWML NE North, what an awesome group of women in mission you are.

I didn't realize how many can use our help. From right here in NE Nebraska, the US, and around the world. In my position I am the one that you contact with suggestions for our ingatherings from collections at our EC meetings, retreats, conventions, etc. I then contact the organizations and along with them we determine what their needs are. I then present them to the EC committee to give suggestions to the BOD to vote upon. I can tell you that those who receive your gifts are very grateful. We have done small ingatherings from collecting socks or mittens, to the large ingathering we did at the June district convention for the Bright Horizon facilities in O'Neill and Ainsworth food bank. If you happened to walk by the library room where we collected all the items, you had to be as amazed as I was at the amount received. It was overwhelming and brought tears to my eyes seeing the generosity extended. When I called Linda at Bright Horizons to tell her we had a slight problem, that the one van they thought would hold our donations would not begin to hold everything she just couldn't believe
