Second Mission Grant Paid

The Nebraska North District LWML second mission grant for the 2018 – 2020 biennium was to Jesus Our Savior Preschool Tuition Assistance for \$10,000. On March 22nd, District Treasurer Karen Peters and Virginia VonSeggren drove to the Winnebago Indian Reservation to present the check to Sheryl Tietz.

This year is the 21st year of operation for this school. There are 18 preschoolers with Sheryl Tietz as their teacher. Sheryl teaches the academic and social skills to prepare the students for kindergarten. But most importantly, Sheryl teaches the children about the love of Jesus along with Pastor Ricky Jacob, a called missionary to Jesus Our Savior Lutheran Outreach. Statistics show that over 80% of the children on the Winnebago Reservation are living in poverty. This fact illustrates the challenge that families face when trying to pay tuition. This grant enables Jesus our Savior Lutheran Preschool to offer tuition assistance to these families.
