

All ladies of St. John's church were invited to participate. President LeAnn Herbolsheimer gave the welcome and a prayer to begin the shower. Carol read LWML devotion, "How to Be a New Mom Mentor" based on the Bible verse from 1 Thessalonians 5:11a: Therefore encourage one another and build one another up. Jill McElhose prepared prizes and shower games. Table decorations were given away as door prizes. Refreshments of tea sandwiches, decorated cake, punch, coffee and water were served.

Monetary donations were given to Grace to use toward photography fees and a portrait of their growing family. She also chose a taggie for the expected baby and was given a hand-made baby blanket for their daughter Lydia and a towel for their son Micah.

One of our goals was to collect at least 80 items for this charity benefit, as LWML is celebrating its 80th anniversary this year. Joy Circle delivered to Bright Horizons in Norfolk on March 15 more than 80 items (28 hand-made taggies, one hand-made blanket, 16 packages of baby wipes, 29 packages of diapers and pullups, six cans of powdered baby formula, one baby lotion, one baby wash, \$105 in gift cards to Walmart and Target and 32 baggies, each containing an LWML Mustard Seed Devotion and two pieces of chocolate candy).
