I wanted to go to Milwaukee this year. I'm sure David would have found it much more pleasant to be a simple shepherd, watching his father's sheep, but God called him to a place and time where he was on the run from Saul for his life. Looked at from that angle, simply staying home from convention was easy, right? But what refraining from other things. What about conversations that veer into discussing someone whose actions lead you to verbal abuse--you know, to gossip? What about when you ignore God's call to worship Him on Sunday, and you instead go to anything other than church? What about when...well, you get the idea. We are sinful people. God calls us to perfection, but we fall far short of that.

But God knew that we can't do all He calls us to do. We can't be perfect. We try to refrain from gossip, we try to always get to church--and to be there mentally as well!--and we try to be people who paint a lovely picture by our actions of what it is to be a child of God. But we fall short. Knowing we would always fall short, Jesus paid for all our shortcomings on that cross on Golgotha. And while we'd like to be better, we're still God's children. God is still the Lord of each one of us. He "looks down from heaven; he sees all the children of man (Psalm 33:13)" and He loves us with an amazing love. So I celebrate being His child. I celebrate even the tough things He calls me to do--well, some of the time, anyway.

And I will be at convention in Omaha in 2025!



I was slowly taking in my meal and her conversation and decided to ask if I could say a prayer for her. Suddenly two customers walk in and quickly get their to-go order. Now I can ask...until a group of six comes in and sits down to enjoy a family meal. I'd eaten as slowly as I could, had another glass of pop, and decided I would still pray, written on a piece of paper I will give her. Before I'm halfway finished, the shop is quiet and empty again.

She willingly agreed to prayer and immediately grabbed Barry's and my hands as if her life depended on this. I prayed, then Barry, and Missy ended with a prayer. She looked up with peace reflecting in her eyes and said, "I really needed that because it has been a very tough week and I felt worthless. Now I know that I'm not." God certainly looked down and saw Missy.


Missionary over the seas or missionary over a sandwich? It doesn't matter where you are; always be open for every opportunity to share God's love and gift of salvation.
